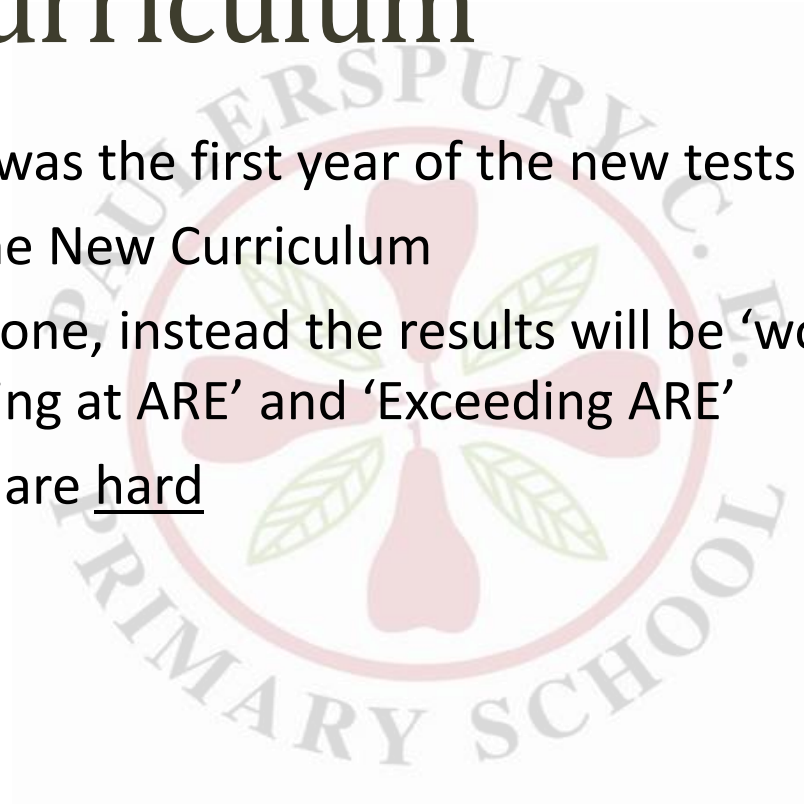


Year 6 SATs Tests

What?

- Six tests
 - Three English
 - Reading
 - Grammar and Punctuation
 - Spelling
 - Three Maths
 - Arithmetic
 - Reasoning x2



When?


- Week commencing the 8th May 2017
 - Monday 8th May: Reading
 - Tuesday 9th May: Grammar/Punctuation
Spelling
 - Wednesday 10th April: Arithmetic
Reasoning
 - Thursday 11th April: Reasoning

Maths - Arithmetic


- Replaced the old 'Mental Maths'
- Designed as quick calculation questions
- No word problems at all
- Use the formal methods as outlined in the calculations policy
 - Column addition/subtraction/multiplication
 - Long/short Division
- 36 Questions – 30 Minutes

Maths - Arithmetic


1. $898 + 300 =$




2. $441 \times 2 =$




3. $6.3 + 2.2 =$




4. $24 \times 5 =$



5. $2,143 + 468 =$

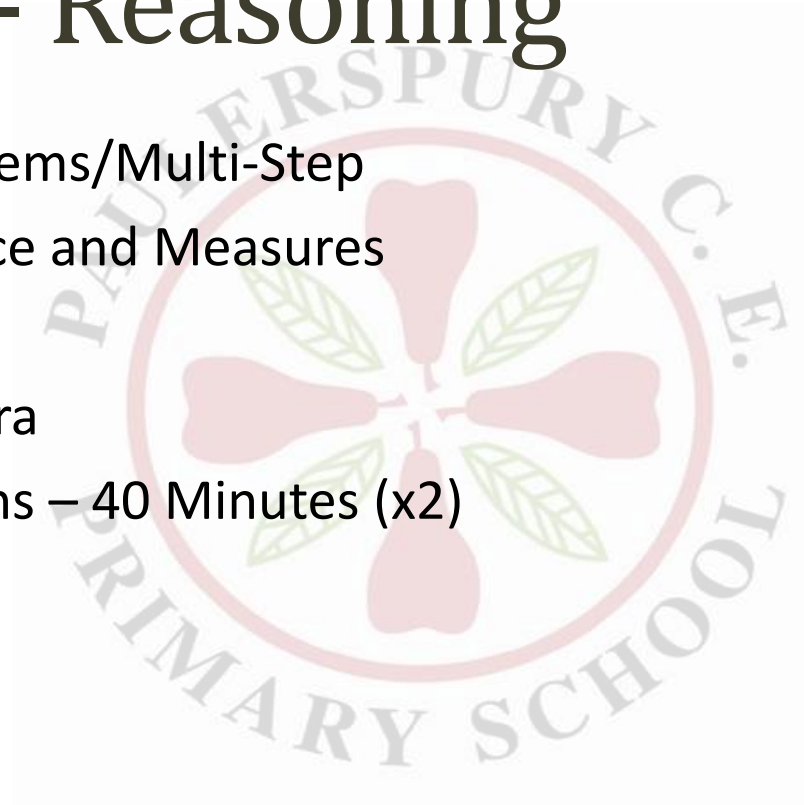


6. $56 \div 7 =$



Maths - Reasoning

- Word Problems/Multi-Step
- Shape, Space and Measures
- Graphs
- Basic Algebra
- 20 Questions – 40 Minutes (x2)

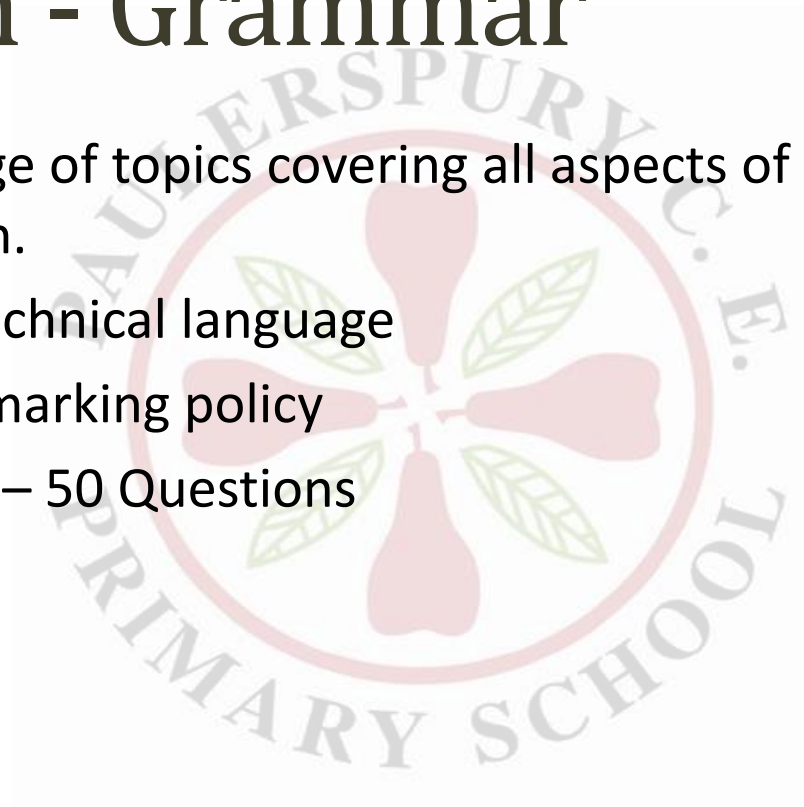


English - Reading

- Three texts
- Set of questions on each individual text
 - Information retrieval
 - Making inferences
 - Author's Choices
- Questions require anything from a basic, one phrase answer to an in-depth response that uses and explains quotations from the text.
- 1 hour long

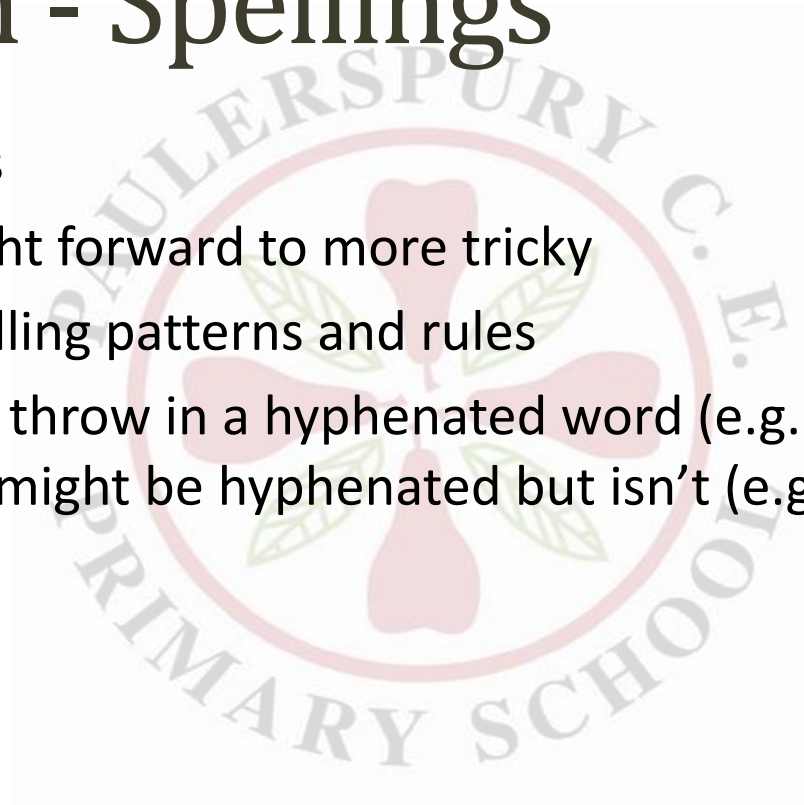
English - Grammar

- A huge range of topics covering all aspects of grammar and punctuation.
- Hard and technical language
- Very strict marking policy
- 45 minutes – 50 Questions



English - Spellings

- 20 Spellings
- Fairly straight forward to more tricky
- A lot of spelling patterns and rules
- They like to throw in a hyphenated word (e.g. re-edit) and ones that sound might be hyphenated but isn't (e.g. misinterpret)

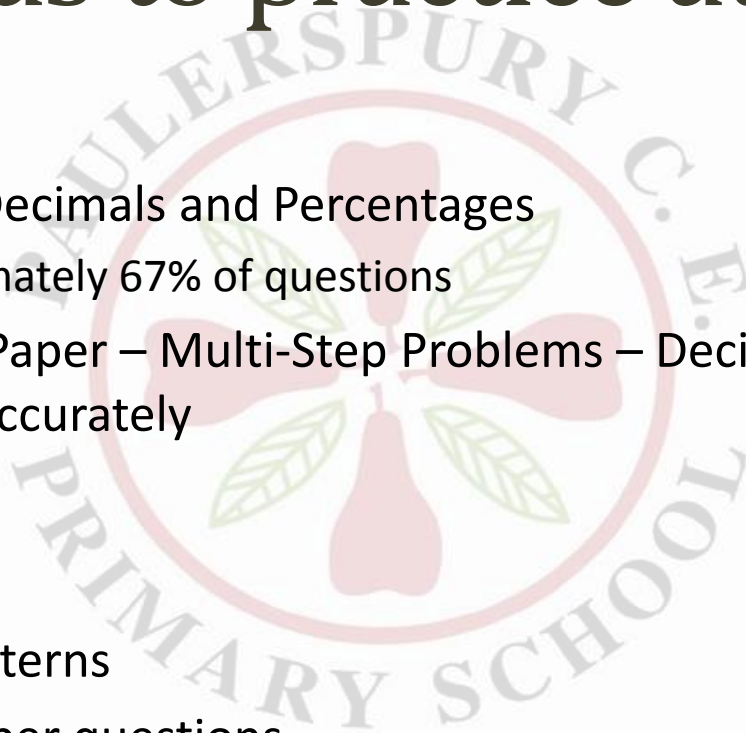


Booster Sessions

- Four Sessions a week
- Each Child has been invited to two
 - English Sessions on Tuesdays
 - Maths Sessions on Thursdays
- Sessions aren't interchangeable – based on common areas for development
- Morning sessions have breakfast supplied
- Miss Chamberlain helping with the Thursday morning session

Key areas to practice at home

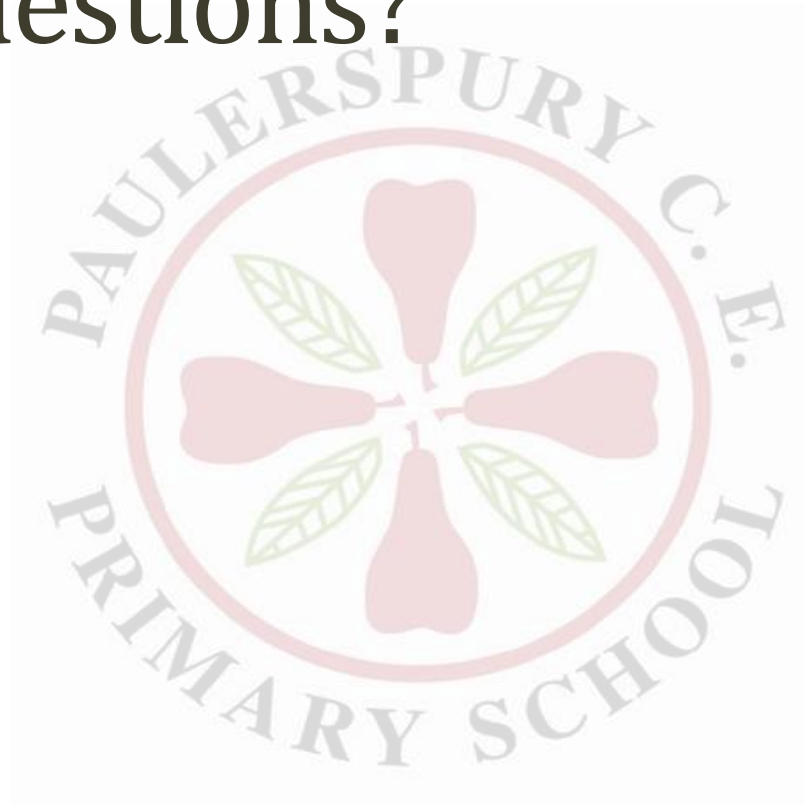
- Maths –
 - Fractions, Decimals and Percentages
 - Approximately 67% of questions
 - Reasoning Paper – Multi-Step Problems – Deciphering the questions accurately
- English
 - Spelling patterns
 - Reading paper questions
